

New Rescue Diver Course

The PADI Rescue Diver will expand your knowledge and experience beyond purely recreational level because you'll learn to look beyond yourself and consider the safety and well being of other divers. Although this course is serious, it is an enjoyable way to build your confidence.

What do I need to start?

- PADI Open Water Diver or PADI Junior Advanced Open Water Diver certification
- Minimum age: 15 years old (12 for PADI Junior Rescue Diver)
- Successful completion of a sanctioned CPR program within the past 24 months, i.e. EFR
- To **qualify**, you complete 4 open water-training scenarios, to attend these, you must be a certified as an advanced diver.

What will I do?

Rescue Diver training will prepare you to prevent problems and, if necessary, manage dive emergencies.

You will read and complete 5 academic modules from your manual and complete the knowledge reviews. Attend dry class to review modules and take your exam.

In the pool or confined water you'll cover:

1. Tired diver
2. Panicked diver
3. Response from shore, boat
4. Distressed diver underwater
5. Missing diver
6. Surface the unresponsive diver
7. Unconscious diver at the surface
8. Exiting with a unresponsive diver
9. First aid for pressure related injuries and oxygen administration
10. Response from shore/boat unresponsive diver

Complete

4 open water scenarios

Final exam prior to open water sessions (50 multi choice questions)

How long will it take?

- Recommended Course 25 hours: 5 class modules, and 10 confined water skills (pool)
- Minimum Open Water Training one day

Option to complete the whole course in 5 open water sessions over 2 days.

What will I need?

- PADI Rescue Diver Crew-Pak
- PADI Rescue Diver video (loaned to you)

What will it Cost?

The basic course fee is **£230.00** plus £28 for the manual, if you require kit hire this is offered at a special course price of £50 for the 2 days.
